

During our recent cold weather, it was necessary to change some procedures that regularly occur at the school. While we had extreme cold weather warnings were in effect, the school doors were opened earlier to ensure that students who arrived earlier than 8:15 were not left outside too long. Covid 19 restrictions made it necessary for students to continue to use their regular entrance in the morning and not come in the front doors as has been the case in the past. Now that our weather has warmed up we want to remind families that our doors are closed until 8:15 and that there is no outdoor supervision on the school grounds in the morning. This is the case also at the end of the day. Once students are dismissed they need to head directly home and not linger on the school grounds. Thank you for your assistance with this and keeping all our students safe at school.




