

# **BRSD** First Ride Program



#### First Ride Program - A Program for First Time Bus Riders

Battle River School Division is pleased to welcome your child to the experience of riding the school bus. As we want this to be a happy and rewarding time for both you and your child, we invite you to take part in the informative "First Ride Program," a school bus safety program for first time bus riders.

This FREE program for students is provided to educate parents and children on how to ride the school bus safely. It is typically for children in Kindergarten however, due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, we will accept any school aged children. This program is open to all students who attend or will be attending any school in Battle River or Elk Island Catholic School Divisions.

#### What Can You Expect

The format for the "First Ride Program" will be as follows:

1. Program starts promptly at 6:30 P.M.

2. Topics covered in the presentation include:

- Bus Driver responsibility
- Parent responsibility
- Student responsibility
- School Board responsibility
- School bus facts and information
- Safety rules on and around the school bus
- 3. Go for a short bus ride to review safe loading, unloading and bus riding procedures.

"First Ride" is a positive learning experience for you and your child. This program gives parents and students a basic understanding of safety, rules, and procedures on the school bus. We hope you will be able to take part in the "First Ride Program".

The program will run approximately 1.5 hours.

#### Frequently Asked Questions - BRSD Transportation

Q: My child actively rode a bus from a rural property to/from school during the 2021/22 school year. Do I need to reapply?

- Students who will be actively riding a rural bus to/from school in June 2022 do not need to reapply for busing, IF rural address <u>AND</u> your school remains the same.
- If your child will <u>NOT</u> be actively riding the bus in June 2022, you will need to reapply for busing. Please apply online through our website.

Q: My child's school will be changing due to going to high school or moving. Do I need to re-apply for busing if they were already on a bus?

YES, anytime you change schools or move, you must reapply for busing.

Q: I met a bus on route so my child could attend a school of choice. Do I need to reapply?

YES, Cross Boundary busing needs to be reapplied for each new school year. You must
contact transportation through email at transportation@brsd.ab.ca to apply. Cross
boundary busing cannot be guaranteed. Transportation will notify families as soon as
route capacities have been determined. (Late August)

Q: My child lives in the City of Camrose and rides a bus to/from school. Do I need to reapply for a new bus pass?

- YES, <u>ALL</u> City of Camrose students (BRSD & EICS) must reapply for busing each school year. BRSD & EICS students can apply online through the BRSD website.
- Eligible students (those living 2.4 KM or further away from their designated school) will be served first.
- Ineligible students (those living closer than 2.4 KM) will be served next on a first come, first served basis, dependant on seat availability. An ineligible fee will apply. Ineligible passes could be revoked if an eligible student requires the seat during the school year.
- Any student who requires a second bus pass will also need to pay the ineligible busing fee, regardless of eligibility.
- Bus passes will be delivered to your child's school and you will receive an email verifying
  ridership and busing details in late August.

#### Application Deadline

Online applications open June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 at 8:00 AM & must be received <u>no later than August 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022</u>.

Applications received after August 12th may not be processed until after school starts.

Bus fees from previous years must be paid in full prior to your application being considered.



# We asked and you answered!



More than 240 people responded to our recent surveys asking about Literacy and Numeracy programs within Battle River School Division. Thank you for sharing your thoughts with us.



#### Here's what you told us about Literacy:

- 95% of respondents feel teachers are providing high quality Literacy instruction.
- Respondents appreciate the large literacy focus in BRSD schools.
   They also appreciate the opportunities students receive for individual support through intervention time and phonics; one on one or small group instruction and speech therapy if needed.
- You also said you'd like schools to provide more. More writing, more small group / one on one time, more
  intervention, more support for home, more resources, more fun and more challenge for those doing well.

#### This is some of what BRSD will be doing next year, based on your input:

- All K-3 schools have been provided resources to support teachers in developing foundational literacy skills, plus
   K-9 teachers will work elbow-to-elbow with our Literacy staff to build skills in small group instruction and creating challenging activities.
- Using writing benchmark assessment to support teachers in planning their writing programs for students.
- Implementing a reading intervention pilot program in 8 schools, as well as working with schools to develop
  flexible timetables that allow for additional intervention time and supports.
- A monthly newsletter supporting literacy at home will be shared with families.

#### Here's what you said has been going well with Numeracy:

- Building confidence, by helping students have a positive attitude and view themselves as 'good at math";
- · Learning fundamental concepts and basic math skills, sometimes using 'the old
- Respondents appreciate working come home, and also having access to Power School, in order to see students' progress.

#### Here's what you would like to see more of, related to Numeracy:


- More emphasis on 'the basics' and more help for those who need it.
- More regular updates to parents from the school, along with ideas and resources to support them at home.
- More challenge and advanced courses for those who are doing well.

#### This is some of what BRSD will be doing next year, based on your input:

- Providing teachers with training on the new Math curriculum and strategies for teaching the basics.
- Schools will be expected to share resources, ideas and communicate with parents, to support their children at home.
- Using Locally Developed Courses, resources and adjusted school timetables to provide opportunities for students who need more challenge in not only Math, but all curriculum areas.

# Late French Immersion at ÉCKS Parent and Student Information Package

#### What is Late French Immersion?

Late French Immersion is a proven program designed for students who want to learn to speak, read and write French to a high degree, but who did not begin the program in Kindergarten or Grade 1. In BRSD, students who take Late French Immersion begin learning French in Grade 6.

#### Who should take Late French Immersion?

Late French Immersion is designed for students:

- Whose first language is not French
  - Parents do not need to speak French for students to join Late French Immersion
  - For over 90% of students currently in French Immersion, neither parent speaks French.
- Who want to develop the ability to speak, read, write and understand French to a high degree.
- Who have good work habits, who are motivated to learn and who want to be successful
- Who want to be in a small class. Our current Late French Immersion class has 15 students

#### What are the benefits to learning French?

French is the second official language of Canada. Students who take Late French Immersion will develop enhanced study, communication and listening skills. Students who understand a second language have increased educational and employment opportunities after graduating. Students will also have better access to other cultures through study and travel.

#### Quality Instruction

Our teacher, Mme Aaron Cammack ensures that all students receive a quality education while also developing their language skills. Mme Cammack creates a positive classroom environment where students are comfortable taking the risks necessary to learn a second language.





# Late French Immersion at ÉCKS What is Late Immersion?


In Late Immersion, you'll learn to speak, read, write and understand French. This means that you'll be able to have conversations in French and travel around the world and be able to communicate with
